# High Commission of India Malta

India - Malta Relations

India and Malta enjoy friendly and cordial relations. India was one of the first countries to recognize independence of Malta in 1964 and established diplomatic relations with it in 1965.

The High Commission was reopened in Malta in Jan 2017 and the resident High Commissioner of India took charge in Jan 2018. Malta opened its High Commission in New Delhi in July 2007 with a resident High Commissioner posted there. It also has Honorary Consuls in Kolkata, Chennai, and Mumbai.

India-Malta bilateral relations have been friendly, with a number of visits having been exchanged between the two sides. A list of recent high level visits between the two countries is as follows:

#### HIGH LEVEL VISITS FROM BOTH SIDES

#### From India to Malta:

- President Shri R. Venkataraman visited Malta in 1990.
- External Affairs Minister Smt. Sushma Swaraj visited Malta on 25-29 November 2015 to attend the CHOGM Summit 2015 as head of the delegation, whereas the Minister of State for External Affairs Gen. (Dr.) V. K. Singh represented India at the Foreign Ministers' segment of CHOGM.
- Minister of State for External Affairs Shri M. J. Akbar visited Malta on 8-10 July 2018. During his visit, Minister of State Shri M. J. Akbar met Foreign Minister of Malta Mr. Carmelo Abela and called on Prime Minister of Malta Dr. Joseph Muscat and President of Malta Ms. Marie-Louise Coleiro Preca.
- Finance) Shri Shiv Pratap Shukla, three Members of Parliament from Rajya Sabha and one Member of Parliament from Lok Sabha visited Malta on 16-18 September 2018. During his visit, Vice President met President of Malta Ms. Marie-Lousie Coleiro Preca, Speaker of the House of Representatives of Malta Mr. Anġlu Farrugia and Acting PM and Minister for the Economy, Investment and Small Businesses of Malta Dr. Christian Cardona. Three MoUs on (i) Maritime Cooperation between Ministry of Shipping, India and Ministry of Transport, Infrastructure and Capital Projects, Malta; (ii) Mutual cooperation between the Foreign Service Institute, India and The Mediterranean Academy of Diplomatic Studies, University of Malta; and (iii) Tourism Cooperation between India and Malta were signed during the visit.

Hon'ble Speaker, Lok Sabha Smt. Sumitra Mahajan visited Malta on 9-11 January 2019 to participate in the Standing Committee Meeting of the Conference of Speakers and Presiding Officers of the Commonwealth.

Minister of State for External Affairs Smt Meenakashi Lekhi visited Malta during 21-23 August 2022. She called on the President of Malta Dr. George Vella and met Dr. Ian Borg Foreign Minister, Mr. Clayton Bartolo, Minister of Tourism and Dr. Owen Bonnici, Minister for National Heritage, Arts and Local Government. She also had an interaction with the Director and Board Members of Mediterranean Academy of Diplomatic Studies.

- Minister for Energy and Water Management of Malta Mr. Joseph Mizzi visited India In February 2018.

During the visit, Minister Abela participated in the India-Europe Business Forum, hosted by FICCI in New Delhi. He met External Affairs Minister Smt. Sushma Swaraj and Minister of State for External Affairs Shri M.J. Akbar during the visit.

- Prime Minister of Malta Dr. Joseph Muscat accompanied by Minister for the Economy, Investment and Small Business of Malta Dr. Christian Cardona and a large business delegation from Malta attended the Vibrant Gujarat Summit on 18-20 January 2019. PM Muscat also met Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on the margins of the Summit.
- Minister for Environment, Sustainable Development and Climate Change of Malta Dr. Jose Herrera visited India to participate in the UNCCD COP14 meeting hosted by India from 2-13 September 2019 and addressed the meeting on 09 September 2019.

Minister for Active Ageing Jo Etienne Abela attended the Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh (FRCSEd) Conference during 6-8 October, 2022. During his extended till October 13, discussions were held on licensing in the pharmaceutical and medical devices industry and Malta's potential to become a Mediterranean hub for surgery education. He led a team of representatives from Malta Medicines Authority and Malta Enterprises to visit Torrents Pharma in Ahmedabad and Aurobindo Pharma in Hyderabad.

Minister of Economy, European Funds and Land Mr. Silvio Schembri took part in the Special Plenary Session of the CII India-Europe Business and Sustainability Conclave on 1st March 2023, in New Delhi. On 28th February, 2023 Minister Schembri discussed his views in an interactive session at the PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry at New Delhi.

Minister of Foreign and European Affairs and Trade Dr. Ian Borg visited India from 06-08 October 2023. He was accompanied by senior officials of the Malta Financial Services Authority. Dr. Borg met External Affairs Minister, Dr. S Jaishankar and had detailed discussions on entire gamut of bilateral relations, including trade & investment, maritime cooperation, renewable energy, tourism, culture and people-to-people ties.

**Foreign Office Consultations (FOC):** India and Malta held the 3rd round of FOC on 29 September 2023 in New Delhi, co-chaired by Shri Sanjay Verma, Secretary (West), Ministry of External Affairs and H.E Mr. Christopher Cutajar, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs & Trade, Malta.

The FOC provided an opportunity for reviewing bilateral engagements and exchanging views on regional and global issues of mutual interest, including developments in our respective neighbourhoods, EU, Ukraine conflict, G20 outcomes under India's Presidency, cooperation in multilateral fora, and UNSC reforms. Both sides also discussed furthering relations in sectors such as trade and investments, consular, migration, skill development, health & pharma sector and cultural linkages.

#### Trade and economic relations

<u>Trade</u>: Trade relations between the two countries have been growing. Trade figures of recent years are as follows:

<u>Main items</u>: Main items of **India's exports** to Malta in 2022 were in the category of pharmaceutical products, petroleum products, wheat, organic chemicals, and ceramic products. The main items of **India's imports** from Malta during this period were in the category of organic and inorganic chemicals, integrated circuits, machinery, and sorted/recovered paper.

## **Culture:**

A cultural agreement between India and Malta was signed in 1992 and remains in force. Cultural events like film festival, food festival and performances of Indian cultural troupes are organized by the High Commission. There is a statue of Mahatma Gandhi in Malta gifted by Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR). Various activities were held by the High Commission to Malta Post issued Commemorative Stamps on the commemorate the event. occasion of 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. This was the second occasion that Malta Post issued commemorative stamp on Mahatma Gandhi, the earlier being in 1969, i.e. on the occasion of 100th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. High Commission also celebrates International Day of Yoga every year which sees enthusiastic participation by both members of the Indian community as well as Maltese citizens. Indian naval ships have regularly visited Malta on goodwill visits. This includes visits of INS Darshak in April 2002 and INS Tarangini in February 2007, June 2015, October 2015, May 2018 and May 2022. During 2021-2023, the High Commission undertook several activities under the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav involving the Indian diaspora in Malta. In 2023, Mission promoted the International Year of Millets and LiFE(Lifestyle for Environment) initiative through several events during the year.

ICCR sponsored Indian musical band 'Astitva' took part in the Destination North festival at St Paul's Bay on September 23, 2023. The band presented another melodious evening of sufi, folk and bollywood songs at First edition of Gozo Theatre Festival in Malta's sister island on 24th September, 2023.

### **Indian Community**

Indian community in Malta is estimated to be around 12,000-15,000, including persons of Indian origin. Several Indian Associations like Malta Malayalee Association, Malta Tamil Association, Bengali Association Malta, Gujarati Association and Navodaya Sanatan Group have been formed in recent years. The Hindu Association of Malta, also formed recently, has many active Indian members.
